Finance Committee

The Church finances for the first half of 2008 are progressing almost as projected in the 2008 budget. The only anomalies were the lower than expected income (giving) in May (approximately one-half) and church utilities continue to be higher than estimated by about 10 - 15%. It appears, the water bill is the main problem. Last months bill was about \$400. We have talked to the Board of Trustees in an attempt to find out why the water bill is so high.

Another category causing some concern, is in the Team Ministries category where VBS exceeded their budget. The cause may be that they got caught-up in the rise in prices on just about everything along with the difficulty in estimating how many children would attend. For example, there were over 70 children registered but the actual was something less.

There will be a Finance Committee meeting at 7:00 PM on August 4, 2008 to primarily discuss Pastor Spooner's compensation package for recommendation to the Ad. Council for approval. The PPRC chairperson and members have been invited to the meeting. I have received an e-mail from the Mountainair UMC discussing how their portion is to be distributed as well as their payment for a portion of Pastor Spooner's moving expenses.

From Bishop Max

Some of My Thoughts

Sunday, July 27, 2008, we worshipped at St. Paul's United Methodist Church in Albuquerque. It was a celebration of God's wonderful gift of salvation in Jesus Christ, fifty years of ministry for that congregation, and God's way of using leaders in that congregation to raise up people for ordained ministry. Dr. Terry Anderson listed the persons he knew who had entered ordained ministry through that congregation, and the report amazed me.

In many congregations, the church's leadership cannot recall a single person who heard and responded to God's call to ordained ministry in the past fifty years. It appears they believe it is the responsibility of other congregations to create an environment where individuals listen and expect God to speak, and for them to respond to God's calling. Most of the time, God communicates with laypersons about how they carry out their ministry in their secular vocations. However, unless individuals listen and expect regular communication from God through Jesus Christ, they will miss those special calls to service and the blessing of being God's instrument of hope and peace.

One of the most powerful witnesses I can remember occurred in my first few weeks of living in New Mexico. I met with the full Cabinet and asked them to share a short version of their call from God and their spiritual journey. Bill Wood began his witness by stating. "God called me to be a lay person." It was not the first time I heard a person make such a bold and confident witness, but I knew immediately that the Conference Lay Leader knew he was on a mission from God. God called him and he responded.

Contrast that witness with one I frequently hear when introductions are being made, "I am Kevin Jones and I am just a lay person." I want to scream. "You are one of Jesus' disciples. Jesus came to this earth, lived, died, and rose again that you might have life—abundant, eternal life—here and now." No one is ever just a layperson, unless he or she is proclaiming that they just show up at church from time to time, know a little about Jesus, but have never made a commitment to follow him as Lord and Savior. God anticipates every person to utilize the talents, gifts, and resources entrusted by God. No one is an unimportant disciple of Jesus Christ.


Understanding one's call from God, demands spending time with God and listening for the very voice of God. Very few persons receive oral communication from God. No loud booming voice from heaven shouts out for one to listen. Instead, the communication from God arrives through friends, neighbors, the study of scripture and the quiet meditative prayers offered as one earnestly seeks to know and do God's will.

I expect every pastor to describe his/her call into ordained ministry as part of one of their sermons during the coming year, and I would urge every Sunday School class to set aside time for members to describe the ways God communicates God's guidance, direction and call upon their lives. The church must rekindle the excitement and joy of hearing and responding to God's great expectations on the lives of those who follow Jesus as Savior and Lord. Grace & Peace,
