





From the Desk of...Pastor Bonnie

God's GRACE is what enables us to be saved through faith in Jesus Christ. Without God's grace, we are utterly lost – unredeemed and unredeemable. But thanks be to God, He has extended to humankind a gift of GRACE (from the Greek, "charis".) God's GRACE is multifaceted – like a diamond, if you will. Looking at it from different angles, different perspectives, helps us to see the true beauty of the gift which God offers us.

PREVENIENT GRACE is that gift which 'comes before' we have knowledge of our need of it. Prevenient is from the Latin: Pre (before) and Veni (to come.) It's the "gift that comes before." I think of this grace as it relates to our Communion liturgy, where we say, "While we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. That proves God's love toward us." While we were YET sinners - before we had any knowledge of our need for salvation in Christ – HE DIED FOR US.



Thousands of years ago, before we were born, He knew our need for salvation and He died for us.

A friend of mine compares prevenient grace with grits on a southern restaurant table. You don't have to order the grits... they just come with the meal. We don't have to ask for God's prevenient grace - IT JUST COMES.

John Wesley also referred to this facet of God's grace as 'Preventing Grace;' the grace which prevents us from moving so far from God that His love cannot reach us.

Another facet of God's Grace is known as <u>JUSTIFYING GRACE</u>. This is the grace we experience when we understand our need for salvation and make the conscious decision to give our hearts to Jesus. Many refer to this as the moment they were saved. And in that moment, it's as if God has chosen to put on rose-colored glasses and look at us in a whole new light – the light of Christ! We, sinful humanity, can only stand in the presence of a Holy God when our debts have been paid. Jesus' death on the cross IS that ransom. And in the blink of an eye, by accepting Jesus' gift of salvation, it's as if we've never sinned at all. It's **JUST-IF-I'D never sinned**.

Being Justified before God is not the end of the story, however. As we respond to God's outpouring of love, we become transformed over time into the very image of Christ. God's **SANCTIFYING GRACE** is what motivates and empowers us to make real changes **IN THIS LIFETIME**. In so doing, we become the hands and feet of Christ in this world. We are enabled to love God more and more and to actually love our neighbors as we love ourselves! The Gospel of Matthew (Ch. 25:31-40) reveals what's known as, 'The Judgment of the Nations.' Scripture says that when Jesus returns, He will put the sheep (those who fed, clothed, visited... 'the least of these') at His right and the goats (those who did not feed, clothe, or visit... 'the least of these') at His left. The sheep will enter the Kingdom of God. The goats... well, let's all hope we're NOT part of the goats! I'm reminded of that billboard, "Yes, there WILL be a TEST! ...love, God."

It's not enough to realize we need Jesus and to give our hearts to Him. We are expected to become more and more LIKE HIM as we grow in God's gift of Sanctifying Grace. If we want to enter the Kingdom, unlike my friend who thought she wanted to grow up into a beautiful gold-rimmed chalice; we should arrive at the Gates with calloused hands, swollen feet, and aching backs... like the well-loved Velveteen Rabbit, our fur rubbed thin... from serving others. Calloused hands – soft hearts overflowing with love.

But there **ARE OBSTACLES to GRACE**. Have you noticed the big "I" in the middle of 'SIN'? I am at the heart of most of my sinning! The word, "Sin" is derived from the Greek, "hamartia." an archery term meaning 'to miss the mark.' There are two primary types of Obstacles to God's grace – two ways we tend to miss the target of obedience to God: Those things that hinder our relationship with God... and those that hinder our relationships with others. Not to belabor the point; but Scripture says that "all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God." Rom. 3:23. We have ALL missed the target. Some of us don't even know there IS a TARGET! Some are shooting in the opposite direction. But if we've given our hearts to Jesus, we MUST look for and aim at the target. With practice, we'll eventually start hitting that bull's eye!

Speaking of PRACTICE; like the old joke asking "How do you get to Carnegie Hall?" the answer of course being, "Practice, practice, practice!" God has made a myriad of ways for us to practice hitting the target of obedience to His Word. Those opportunities for practice are known as **THE MEANS of GRACE**. Practicing or participating in the Means of Grace facilitates the flow of God's love to us and our appropriation and application of that love in our everyday lives. The Means of Grace are like vehicles carrying the precious cargo of God's love TO US and THROUGH US to light the dark corners of this broken world. The Means of Grace include things like Prayer, studying the Scriptures, celebrating Holy Communion, being Baptized and Confirmed, participating in Worship, observing the awe of God's general revelation in Nature, Fasting, Meditating on His Word, Listening for the Holy Spirit... and the list goes on and on.

Thanks be to God, there is always more of His Grace than there is of our sin: "Grace, grace, God's grace... grace that will pardon and cleanse within! Grace, grace, God's grace... grace that is greater than all our sin!" (UMH p. 365, *Grace Greater Than Our Sin*)





The Other 12 Disciples

HOT LAVA in the ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MEETING!

The Promised Land-NM

The Promised Land-NM has been distributing food from the Road Runner Food Bank since 2005. For the last 5 months, the Mountainair Methodist Church has been allowing The Promised Land-NM to use their fellowship hall to distribute food.

The food is distributed once a month, on the third Tuesday of the month. Every month, around 90 to 100 households receive over 50 pounds of food each, for free. This includes over 150 adults and 75 children each month. Many needy families in Southern Torrance County benefit from this program. Without the help and loving support of the Mountainair Methodist Church and Pastor Bonnie Hardesty, this program might not be possible.

When Satan is knocking at your door, simply say, "Jesus, could you get that for me?"





WHAT ABOUT LENT?

Lent, the season of the Christian Year that is typically observed as a time of simple living, prayer and fasting leading up to Easter, begins next week, on Ash Wednesday [March 5, 2014].
