



So, What's the Big Deal about Father's Day?

There was a time, not too long ago, that Father's Day barely managed to garner a blurb on the American conscience. It came across as an afterthought to Mother's Day, and the only reason dads got any publicity at all was due more to the convenient rhyme scheme of "dads" and "grads" than any collective call to celebration.



However,

Here are some statistics that may help us understand the value of a dad in the home:

- 85% of all children that exhibit behavioral disorders come from fatherless homes –*Center for Disease Control*
- 71% of all high school dropouts come from fatherless homes –*National Principals Association Report on the State of High Schools*
- 70% of juveniles in state operated institutions come from fatherless homes –*U.S. Dept. of Justice, Special Report Sept., 1988*
- 85% of all youths sitting in prisons grew up in a fatherless home –*Fulton County Georgia jail populations & Texas Dept. of Corrections, 1992*

Christian Dads Make a Difference...

But God knew this from the beginning. The New Testament gives this word of family instruction, 1. Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 2. Honor your father and mother (which is the first commandment with a promise), 3. So that it may be well with you, and that you may live long on the earth.

4. Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord. (Ephesians 6:1-4).

There are two words here for us as children, "obey" and "honor." There are two commands here for us as Dads, "do not provoke" (by having unachievable expectations) and "bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord." In other words, the primary duty of a Christian dad, apart from a non-Christian dad is making sure their children learn about Jesus.

One of the goals for men's ministry groups is to help each other become the kind of dads we all want to be...the kind of dads God wants us to be.

Dads, keep your chin up! You have a tough job, but know that you make a true difference!
