



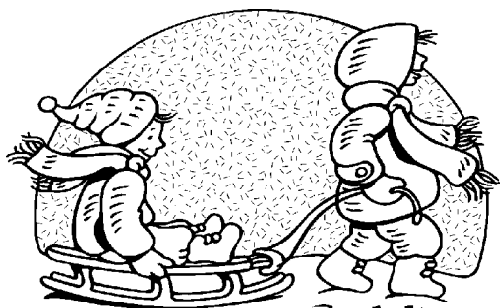

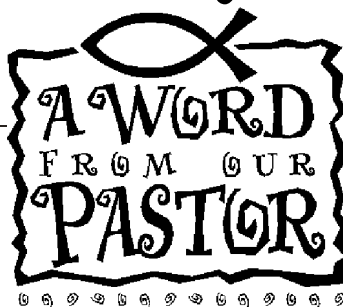

One of my favorite books of the Bible is **James**. Even though **Luther** thought it to be a “book of straw,” because, to him, it stressed works righteousness. I find it to be a book that helps me understand what it is to be truly Christian.

Recently I was in Albuquerque and ran across a Christian tract that fascinated me. It was titled, “**Endurance: Standing Firm in a Throw-Away World.**” Just the day before I had received a very thorough, provoking e-mail regarding the refining of silver (elsewhere in this newsletter). When those coincidences happen, you know that **God** is speaking to you.

All too often, Christians think that their lives should be trouble free, but that isn’t what scripture indicates. **God** does not promise Christians easy passage through life. **James** makes this clear in the opening of his letter. “Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance. Perseverance must finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything” (*James 1:2-4*). All of us live with pressures, the saved and

unsaved alike. **God** has a unique purpose in exposing His children to trials and challenges. **God** intends to bring us to maturity in our faith by refining us in the fires of trial. Only pressure can bring about the growth and development that **God** desires for us. The best example in nature that helps us understand this process is the *refining of gold and silver*.

It is important for us to understand the proper response to trials and the reason we face them. One of the first thoughts in our minds when trials come along in our life is: "Where did I get off track?" **James**, and others like **Paul** and **Peter**, teach us that testing is not a result of wrongdoing; it is simply part of **God's** plan. Neither is **God** interested in applying pressure so that His people give up, "Well, what can I do? I guess I will just have to learn to live with it." There is an active quality to endurance. We are called to a tenacity of spirit, which holds up under pressure while waiting **God's** time for reward or dismissal. This is sometimes easy for us to do for a week or even a few months, but when it goes on for years, that's another story. Yet this is when true endurance comes into play. Endurance and staying power is a trait we admire in others but not something we seek for ourselves.

While we live in a world that tries its best to avoid any kind of pressure and works to get rid of any difficulty, whatever the cost, the Bible teaches us that we should expect troubles and challenges as a part of Christian maturation. Many of us understand the necessity of exercise for a health body. The exercise builds endurance and the body is healthy and strong only as it is kept fit. Why do we have such a hard time seeing the necessity of spiritual training? In the same way we must learn to appreciate what God is carrying out in us as individuals and as the body of **Christ** to build us into a strong and mature spiritual body. God knows what we need to become mature Christians and what His church needs to become the true *Body of Christ*. So when things look impossible and when we feel stretched beyond our capability to endure, let us remember that **God** has a plan. It is time to turn to Him and seek his will and strength to move through the current time of testing so that we might become mature and strong in spirit and in truth. **James** goes so far as to say, "**Consider it pure joy...**

Refiner of Silver

Malachi 3:3 says: "He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver."

This verse puzzled some women in a Bible study and they wondered what this statement meant about the

character and nature of **God**. One of the women offered to find out the process of refining silver and get back to the group at their next Bible Study.

That week, the woman called a silversmith and made an appointment to watch him at work. She didn't mention anything about the reason for her interest beyond her curiosity about the process of refining silver. As she watched the silversmith, he held a piece of silver over the fire and let it heat up. He explained that in refining silver, one needed to hold the silver in the middle of the fire where the flames were hottest as to burn away all the impurities. The woman thought about **God** holding us in such a hot spot then she thought again about the verse that says: "He sits as a refiner and purifier of silver."

She asked the silversmith if it was true that he had to sit there in front of the fire the whole time the silver was being refined. The man answered that yes, he not only had to sit there holding the silver, but he had to keep his eyes on the silver the entire time it was in the fire. If the silver was left a moment too long in the flames, it would be destroyed.

The woman was silent for a moment. Then she asked the silversmith, "How do you know when the silver is fully refined?" He smiled at her and answered, "Oh, that's easy - when I see my image in it."

If today you are feeling the heat of the fire, remember that **God** has His eye on you and will keep watching you until **He sees His image in you**.

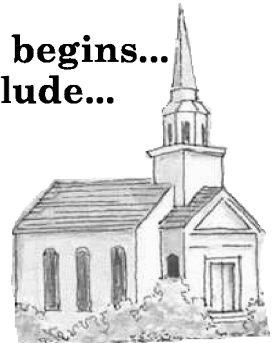

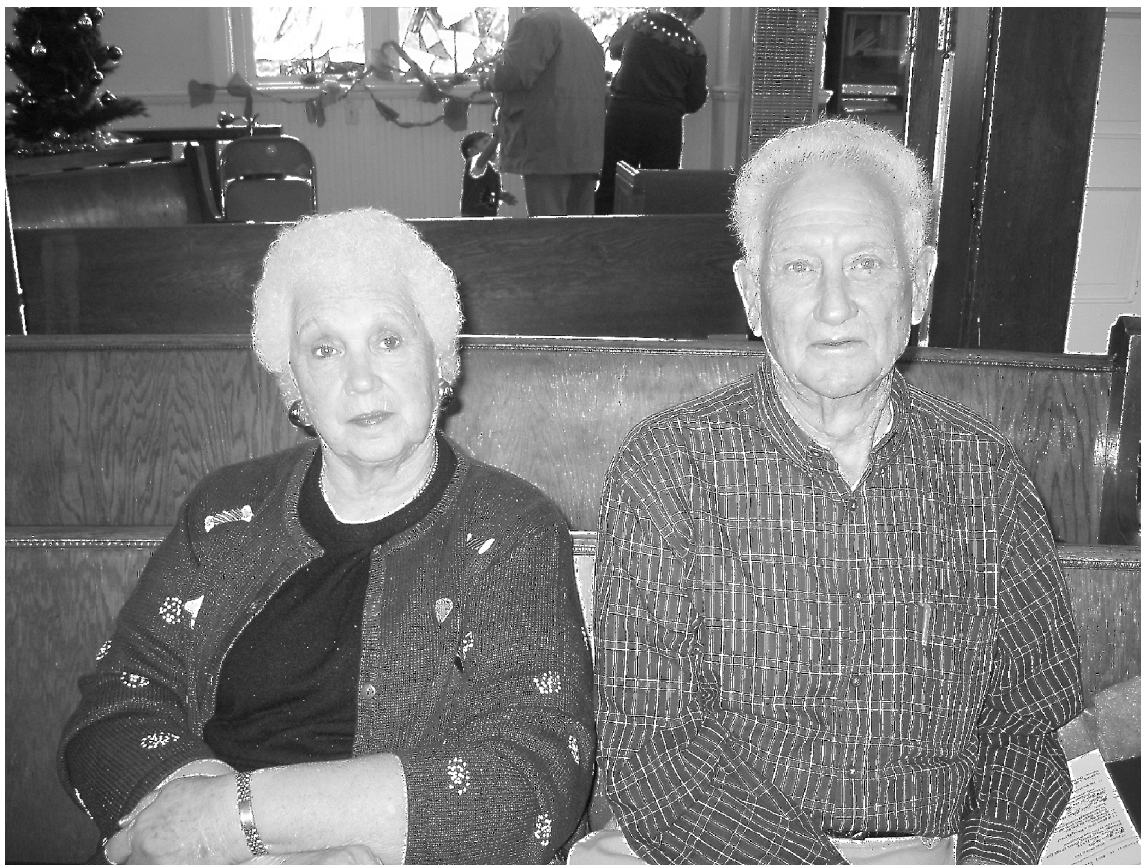
