

Who likes waiting at stop lights? They say patience is a virtue. Being patient is a wonderful characteristic to have but who wants to wait for it, and it is almost gone from our society. Everything is fast paced. Today, the day after Thanksgiving, Sylvia stopped by to drop off some stamps before heading to the Big City. I mentioned something about beating all the traffic because the mall shoppers won't be out before 10:00 a.m. She said, "The stores opened at 5:00 a.m." "5 o'clock", I said! Finance and Stewardship Committees

Some of the things that helped was giving has been very good and some items, such as utilities were less than estimated due to a drop in utility costs. The Administrative Council will consider our projected budget for 2007 at the next meeting scheduled for November 30, 2006.

The Stewardship Program is in full swing as you may have noticed in the church bulletin last Sunday, November 19, 2006 and the bulletin inserts over the past three weeks. The inserts will continue for the next five weeks and another church bulletin on December 3, 2006 which we have designated Commitment Sunday. The letter we sent to the congregation dated November 1, 2006, addressed the inputs from the recent survey of the congregation on what ministries they would like to see our church implement. Another letter to the congregation is scheduled for the latter part of November to include a Commitment Card to be filled out and turned in on Commitment Sunday, December 3, 2006. A new item on the Commitment Card this year is a box that you can mark to indicate you would like to give a portion of your estate to the Methodist Foundation. Remember 2 Corinthians 9:7 "Each man should give what he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." For Christ has come. . .



Upper Room 9-11-06

The little book of Obadiah, the shortest book in the Old Testament, was written after the Babylonians had exiled the people of Judah. During this time, God's exiled people suffered. The prophet levels a scathing attack on Judah's neighbor, Edom, accusing those people of standing by while Judah was conquered and Jerusalem plundered. He said Edom even gloated at what was happening, joining in the plundering of Jerusalem and aiding the conquerors.

One message of this little book is that our deeds have consequences. Verse 15 says, "As you have done, it shall be done to you; your deeds shall return upon your own head." Neither nations nor individuals can ignore the suffering of others or contribute to it without encountering the consequences.

However, suffering and violence are not God's will for the world; God desires only good and peace for all creation. Even though it sometimes seems that our circumstances are as Obadiah pictures them, God brings new hope and promise to a world filled with terrorism and all other kinds of evil.

Prayer: Merciful God, save us from our own pride.
Help us to look upon those in need with loving concern as you do, Amen.

Thought for the day
God calls us to act when we see injustice. Doing nothing is not acceptable.
